## **MINUTES**

The meeting of the Mount Jackson Hometown Partnership was held at Curtain Call CoffeeHouse Café with virtual participation through ZOOM, the meeting was held at 5:30 PM, Thursday October 15th 2020.

The meeting was called to order by John Boor followed by invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Karen Costie updated the committee on the AD's being run in the Northern Virginia Daily as well as in the Chimney Rock and the Mountain Courier. John asked for two signs to be created to notify the public.

John asked Tyler for an update on the Ghost Tour and he stated that he would work with Lynn Lake on the set up for the timing of the Tour as well as making sure that smaller groups were organized as the 100 people at one time was not manageable last year.

John mentioned that the last subject that he wished to discuss was the volunteers the day of the event. He mentioned working with the local police department as well as the schools for volunteers. It was discussed that helpers would be needed in working with the vendors, picking up trash, and helping with other odds and ends.

John updated the committee that the Christmas parade may need to be cancelled if there is a lack of turn out or interest.
